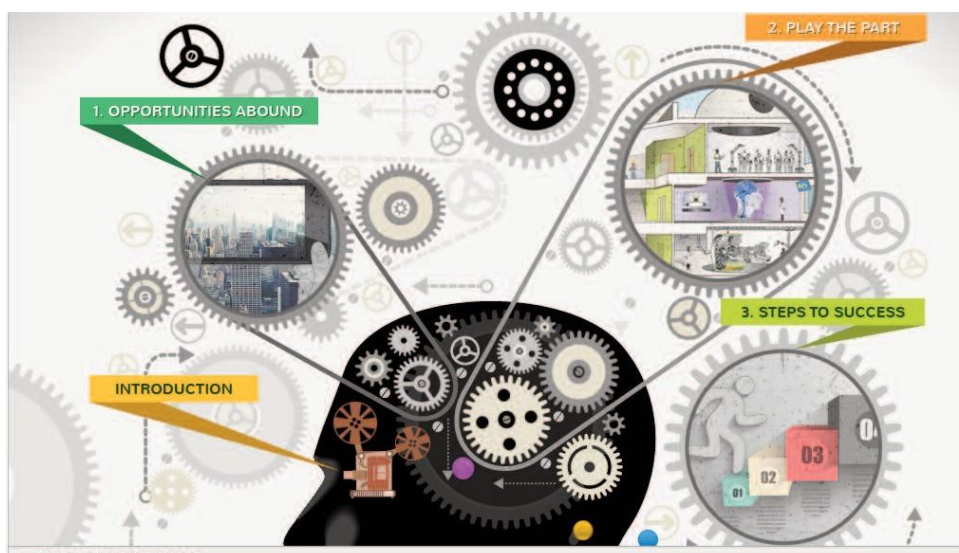


Activity One – Online Activity
